National and International Appeals and Programmes

One Name and One Future - helping the children of Syria: In Syria **one over four children suffers from mental disorders**, almost two millions of them do not go to school and 70% of 458 cases studied, have shown clear signs of **trauma caused by the conflict**. These traumas are "invisible wounds" that the conflict has already left in the little Syrians. Many of them are abandoned or orphans, many were conceived by rape and violence. For this reason no one wants to have anything to do with them. They are not registered in the registry office, **they do not have a name and because of this they have no hope, no future.**

For this reason the Association pro Terra Sancta, together with the Franciscans of the Custody of the Holy Land and together with Mons. Abou Khazen, Bishop of Aleppo, the Grand Mufti of Aleppo and the Franciscan Fr. Firas Lufti, have launched the initiative **ONE NAME AND ONE FUTURE**. With this project we want to **help 2,500 of these little orphaned** Syrians of Aleppo who were abandoned by everyone and in need of everything: water, food, but also a psychological and social recovery.

Safeguarding Research project: Dr Craig Harper from Nottingham Trent University, along with safeguarding colleagues working in a church context, is conducting some research on how members of various communities make sense of allegations of abuse. The research hopes to establish some of the factors that may affect people's willingness to believe allegations of abuse in various settings. Dr Harper and his colleagues hope that this research, which is the first of its kind in the UK, will shed light on how members of different

communities make these decisions. This knowledge will help institutions to better serve and protect the children and adults they are responsible for. The research involves completing an online questionnaire, which should take approximately 10 minutes. It is completely confidential and you have the right to withdraw at any point. All or Nothing: Sr. Clare Crockett - A New Film: Produced by the Foundation EUK Mamie—HM Television, its storyline goes straight to our hearts and beckons us to ask ourselves what we are giving (or not giving) to God. It tells the inspiring story of Sr Clare Crockett who lost her young life in an Ecuadorian earthquake in 2016.

The 4th Edition also takes into account *Mitis Iudex Dominus Iesus*, 'The Gentle Judge, our Lord Jesus, the Shepherd of Souls', the document published by Pope Francis in 2015 which gives a more streamlined and readily accessible way of proceeding in cases concerning the declaration of the nullity of a marriage.
