Refugee Resettlement Volunteer Development and Befriending Scheme:

West Sussex County Council to support families in their resettlement journey is looking for volunteers who would provide a crucial role in helping them to find their way around, get to know places and people in the local area, feel safe and confident and have a friendly face to talk to, and volunteers can offer a range of support around English language learning, finances, shopping, safety and wellbeing, childcare and so forth. We work with a range of volunteer organisations and groups who between them provide a wide and diverse range of support depending on their interests, skills and background. This is particularly focussed on ensuring that families are supported with developing independence and confidence.

Volunteers wouldn't be attached to or recruited by WSCC but would instead be attached to/work alongside an existing volunteer group, which they will facilitate if they are not already part of an established group. They are looking for individual volunteers as well as any groups or organisations that wish to

support families.

Welcoming the Stranger - let a home to a Refugee Family: Millions of refugees are Syrian families forced to flee during eight years of war.

The Vulnerable Persons Resettlement Scheme (VPRS) enables the most vulnerable families to be relocated from refugee camps in the Middle East to a safe country where they rebuild their lives. West Sussex CC are part of the UK Government's commitment to the UNHCR scheme with ring fenced financial help. Are you someone who could offer a two or three bedroom house, or flat, in Crawley, or East Grinstead (preferably with a garden), available for 12 months minimum, near good public service and transport links, and available now or in the near future? The rent for the house/ flat offered would be to rent at local housing benefit rates.

This means they have to move next year, but they have not yet secured a suitable place for them to move onto. A long let is therefore essential given their journey from Syria to the UK. As a three-generational family of six people they have the following needs:

- long let
- a three or four bedroomed house
- ideally a downstairs bedroom or room that can be used as a bedroom
- a downstairs WC or bathroom
- easy transport links (they do not have a car)
- close to shops and schools
- plenty of light
- ideally a garden

- sustainable rent (currently on benefits, but planned employment early next year)

If you are a landlord, you would have the opportunity to meet the family before offering a let to them, and Worthing 4 Refugees would obviously be happy to provide references.
